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PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2022

Dear Alden Cousins and Friends,

It has been a busy and productive year here at the Alden Historic Sites in Duxbury. Just like our ancestors, we have survived a pandemic and never closed our doors. We are now back in full swing. We adapted well to new ways to function and communicate. Our virtual presence grew significantly, and further design of our website will soon become reality. The goal is to make your access via mobile phones and iPad as easy, interesting, and functional as from a computer. We have become nimble Zoom users, and I particularly want to thank our Board Members for their loyal attendance and participation in the business of running our National Historic Landmark this past year.

This year has been one of decision-making and action. We wisely revisited our Alden Building Campaign (ABC) as the pandemic cost us a full year of action and many distractions for everyone workwise, health wise and family wise. I am pleased to report that despite all those obstacles we have raised \$850,000 towards our \$2.3 million goal. When fully funded, this will provide the means to preserve our historic assets in perpetuity and create a two-story addition to the barn that will house the Alden Center for Living History! We have reshaped our goal, revised our materials, increased our outreach and now are going full steam ahead. But we need your help to get us over the finish line. We need every Alden to do their part to make certain our history and that of the Mayflower passengers remains an integral part of the History of America.

If you have not yet joined this campaign, please do. If you are one of our early donors, thank you, and if you can continue that support, we welcome you to do so.

"Many hands make light work", and I think the Aldens are up to the task. If every Alden Kindred member contributes, we will reach our goal very quickly.

Our First Site has demanded our attention again this year. We are actively working on plans to enhance learning at the First Site, which is located next door behind Duxbury Schools. We continue our efforts to work with the town to codify access to our First Site and protect it in perpetuity. The cellar hole was discovered in the 1960s during an archaeological dig, along with thousands of artifacts. It is imperative that we have a formal deed of gift regarding ownership of the artifacts and that we make certain that the land is protected.

We just finished putting a new roof on the Alden Barn. It was leaking and the drainpipes needed to be replaced. We used cedar shingles, and when the new two-story addition is done, it will match the roof of that building. The roof is beautiful and when you look at it, you can envision the new addition and the impact that it will have.

The Executive Director's report will detail progress on the Alden House chimney and other issues to preserve our ancestral home.

As we look to the future, our primary focus will be to finish our fully accessible addition and create the Center for Living History. Toward that end, our Education Committee is in the process of developing a whole new curriculum in consultation with the public schools for multiple age groups. Our new curriculum and other adult education programs will be accessible to the world. The curriculum will meet current standards and age-appropriate usage. We will continue to have our hands-on programs at the Alden House and First Site.

We will continue our genealogical research on the Alden Family and grow our membership in the Alden Kindred. We welcome the next generation of Alden leaders to get more involved in our governance, our programs, and keep increasing our footprint in history over the decades ahead.

Pits, Post and Palisades: The Archaeology of Patuxet and the 17th century Plymouth Colony Settlement. For the last decade archaeologists from University of Massachusetts Boston have been excavating remains of the original 17th-century Plymouth Colony settlement and Wampanoag settlement of Patuxet in downtown Plymouth, MA. On Cole's Hill evidence for Patuxet has been uncovered, while on Burial Hill structures from the early English settlement dating from ca. 1620-1650 have been discovered and documented. This presentation showcases the results of our excavations, highlighting the many different artifacts unearthed, the evidence for the earliest English building construction methods, and the relationship between the English and Wampanoag settlements.

KA's capital campaign to create the Alden Center for Living History is in full \triangle swing and has just passed the \$870,000 mark on its way to the \$2.3 million goal.

Launched last year, the Alden Building Campaign aims to do three things:

- A. Preserve our historic assets by creating a dedicated endowed fund with \$500,000 to be used only for preservation, restoration and protection of our National Historic Landmark.
- B. Build a two-story addition to the Alden Barn to create the Center for Living History (\$1 million). The proposed 2,400 square-foot addition will provide a state-of-the-art year-round handicapped accessible building that will offer exhibits, living history demonstrations, educational programs and gallery talks to share Duxbury's Colonial and Native American story with the world.
- C. Continue to expand our financial base to meet the capacity building for this next century by dedicating \$500,000 to an endowment and \$300,000 to retire the mortgage on the additional land acquired in 2015 that has made this project possible.



DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Alden Kindred Members and Friends,

Well into my seventh year as director, I have come to appreciate not only the persistent courage and

determination of John and Priscilla, but also the family's ability, continually demonstrated over four centuries, to maintain its steadfastness and adapt to challenging circumstances.

During the journey across the pond with their fellow *Mayflower* voyagers in 1620, John and Priscilla could not have fully anticipated the hardship and danger awaiting them, but the harsh reality of life in the early days of the colony did not convince either of them to return. Instead, they, along with their comrades, chose to find love and opportunity in the New World. AKA member Sydney Blake has masterfully captured their cheerful and courageous outlook in her new romantic comedy, *Young Pilgrims The Play*. Her retelling of the familiar story from a young person's perspective, which is playing through the summer here in Duxbury at the First Parish Church, reminds us of the unchanging nature of youth that connects generations through time.

John and Priscilla's legacy of persistence and perseverance is alive and well today at Alden House. This past year we emerged from COVID lockdowns to a difficult economy, a national trend of declining museum attendance, and continuing changes to how history is being taught. Despite the challenges, AKA has pressed forward with its plan to build the Alden Center for Living History. The project continues forward along three lines of effort. The capital campaign to fund construction is now approaching its goal of \$1 million raised and President Pauline Kezer is pressing to reach this objective before fall. The second line of effort that has already paid dividends is the ongoing creation of digital content for the museum to showcase scholarship and artifacts about the Aldens and the First Site. You may have explored the new selfguided QR code-activated tour of the site or joined one of recent Zoom webinars. The third, much less visible now but equally important line of effort, is the follow-on fund raising that will be required to build the endowment and support future operations that will keep the Alden legacy as visible tomorrow in the public mind as it is today.

A year ago I wrote of the generosity of our members that allowed us to take advantage of the matching grant from the Massachusetts Cultural Council Facilities Fund that we used to begin the Technical and Feasibility study necessary to design the Alden Center for Living History. A year later we have a land survey, preliminary site plan, and architectural drawings to share – "The bounds of the land of Mr. John Alden att Duxburrow, as it was layed forth ...as followeth...from an old pine tree"...has undergone a few changes over the years! We are also making progress on some land use and local zoning issues.

Each year we try to highlight something in the museum collection and this year focused on the archaeology. One of the most well-preserved artifacts from the 1960 excavation was an Oak Tree Sixpence, perhaps lost through a hole in the pocket of an (unhappy!) Alden child playing in the garden. The sixpence was recast in a limited edition of challenge coins and keychains and available for sale in the museum shop. Get yours today!

As we teased last year, funding from the Rockwell Foundation was going to support a professional land survey of the area in the vicinity of the foundation of John and Priscilla's original homesite, located a several hundred feet from the current Alden House. The surveyor, Mark Casey, has located three of the original Roland Robbins survey grid markers and verified the location of the First Site house foundation within the grid. Ongoing work with the Town of Duxbury will enable AKA to help protect the First Site archaeological area and continue to improve the interpretative experience at this historic treasure.

This year has been the "Tale of Two Roofs." We topped off our fiscal year construction effort by replacing the deteriorating roof on the barn with red cedar shingles, and we replaced the conventional shingled roof of the cottage behind.

Evaluation of the Alden House chimney continues. Using grant funds from the Felicia Fund as follow-up to last year's report from restoration mason John Millett of Millett Masonry and Contracting, we have hired structural engineer John Wathne of Structures North, who specializes in historic preservation. Building on the mason's report and assistance from architect Bill Thayer, John is assessing the root cause of the movement of a supporting pier and an attached lintel (horizontal beam that spans the fireplace) that is shared by the parlor and kitchen fireplaces. He will also work with Bill to further understand root causes and remedies for the deteriorating condition of the interior bricks in the top twelve feet of the chimney. Last but certainly not least, funding from a second grant from the 1772 Foundation and Preservation Massachusetts will support repainting and restoration of all the exterior windows this fall.

The 15th annual Speak for Thyself Event was held on May 12, 2022, at 7 pm at the Jones River Trading Post in Kingston, MA. This was the most successful Speak event to date in terms of revenue and attendance. Total revenue from ticket sales, sponsorships and advertising was \$15,201 and 93 supporters attended.

We honored three local women with Speak for Thyself awards: Thyme Sullivan, Lily Leedom and Michelle Marchetti Coughlin. Sadly, he passed away in April at the age of 90 so we thought it would be a great legacy to create this scholarship in his honor.

I would like to thank the committee for their fabulous efforts for the 2022 Speak event: Desiree Mobed, Jae Dunn, Pauline Kezer, Adryn Sumner, Pam Smith, and Emily Zoltowski. IN MEMORIAM

The Alden Kindred lost two long-serving members this year.



Gary Campbell of Poughkeepsie, NY, who was the First Vice President of the Alden Kindred Board of Directors, left us this spring after a long battle with health issues. Gary served in many different capacities for over 20 years. He will be missed at the Reunion this year, as he and his wife, Florence, always drove from NY with their beloved grandaughter Lily to be here on his ancestral land. We shall honor Gary at this year's Reunion.



In Duxbury, Alden "Rink" Ringquist was known as an "Alden" all over town. He served as Director many years ago and remained active up to the time of his death at 91 years. AKA historian Tom McCarthy recalled that Rink played an essential role in our efforts to win a National Historic Landmark designation for the house and the First Site, and that Rink's enthusiasm, energy and people skills were especially helpful in building a partnership with the Town of Duxbury to facilitiate the process.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE UPDATE

The ten members of the Education Committee are made up of educators, historians, authors and journalists who have met via Zoom over the past months to discuss the goals requested by Alden Kindred President, Pauline Kezer. The committee members are in complete agreement that the early *Mayflower*, Pilgrim and Native histories are not being given the time and attention needed in schools today to truly understand the earliest days of our American story. The first phase of discussion focused on which elements of the Alden, *Mayflower*, Native and early Plymouth Colony histories should be compiled into units and shared with classrooms across the country. Once in agreement, the members divided the determined historical areas, and drew up a basic outline of bullet point topics to present per appropriate age group at the elementary, middle and high school levels. We also discussed virtual classroom education possibilities from Alden House to classrooms across the country, as well as pertinent historical field trips, teacher webinars and content for the new Center for Living History at the Alden House Historic Site. I will compile all of the findings and outlines and present the committee's recommendations to the board by early August. We are very grateful to all of the members who have given so generously of their time and expertise.

Alden Kindred Annual Meeting 2021 Minutes

Alden Kindred Annual Meeting: August 7, 2021

The 121st annual meeting of the Alden Kindred convened in person and by Zoom on August 7, 2021, in a tent on the Alden House grounds. Just before the official meeting began, President Pauline Kezer at 10:30 a.m. presented special greetings on Zoom from afar from Ryan Curley, the 2019 Dr. Donnell B. Young scholarship recipient and grandson of former Alden Kindred president Linda Osborne. The current winner of that scholarship, Molly Holbrook, speaking on Zoom from Minnesota, also expressed her gratitude to the Kindred.

President Pauline Kezer then gaveled the meeting to order at 10:35 a.m. and rang the Alden bell four times for the four hundred years since 1620, and then rang it once again for the present year. The New Plimmoth Gard led the Pledge of Allegiance, and the Rev. Peter J. Smith gave the blessing. A greeting from our not-yet-official "Twinning City" of Dorking, England, was presented from the home where the Mullins family lived, which is now a coffee shop and bakery.

Board Secretary Evelyn Walker provided a synopsis of the 2020 annual meeting minutes, followed by Treasurer Alden Keyser's financial report. He said that the Kindred had an operational gain due to "Desiree and her crack staff," the endowment fund grew, and that many people are donating to the Capital Campaign. Alden quoted William A. Ward's inspirational message, ending with "Before you die, give."

President Pauline Kezer reminded all present about the importance of preserving the Alden House because of its authenticity and its *Mayflower* connection. She said it is our duty to celebrate all the early families and that everyone is welcome to become a member of the Alden Kindred.

Executive Director Desiree Mobed reported on this year's scholarships. Weston Moran is the recipient of the John and Priscilla Alden Scholarship, which is given to a Duxbury High School student each year. He was in New Hampshire and spoke to the reunion attendees on Zoom. Desiree presented an excerpt of a Zoom interview between donor Randal Charlton and recipient Maya Stahl, who received the Charlton Foundation Scholarship. Maya also received the "Aspiring Priscilla" award in person at the "Speak for Thyself" awards dinner, held on the Alden House grounds on August 5.

Pauline thanked the two Board members who are retiring from the Board this year: Jan Phillips and Adryn Sumner. Presenting the latter with a gift, Pauline thanked Adryn for being the star of the Alden Kindred film and for her work on promoting the Aldens via her Facebook page.

Genealogist Christopher Lee announced that 94 distinct lineages and six multiple lineages from John and Priscilla were verified this year. Christopher thanked Bob Holmes for his tremendous help. The number of lineages from Joseph were greater than from Elizabeth this year, which is unusual.

Membership Committee member Tom Delano reported on membership for the chair of the Membership Committee, Gary Campbell, who was unable to be present due to health concerns. Tom reported that we have 181 new members in fiscal year 2021. They include 8 life members, 108 individual, and 65 family memberships. In total there are 2577 current members, 2212 of whom are billable members.

Pauline thanked Alden Keyser for his generosity in matching donations to the Capital Campaign (up to \$500,000) and for all his help and advice in managing the Endowment. Pauline also recognized architect Bill Thayer, who not only did the original plans for the Barn, but was always there whenever a problem arose. She presented him with a copy of the Duxbury 2020 book, *Duxbury Our Pilgrim Story*. He graciously accepted her thanks and said that there is a core of people who are sustaining and cherishing the initial spirit of the original settlers. He also said that the Alden Historic Site is an anchor for the Town of Duxbury.

Alden Kindred Annual Meeting 2021 Minutes

Christopher Lee, Chair of the Nominating Committee, presented the new slate of board members. They are: Tom McCarthy, historian; Paul Clemente, who has a special interest in Judah Alden and whose grandfather was born in the Alden House; Peter Randall, whose mother Pat Randall was involved with the Alden House for fifty-seven years; and Jennifer Sinsigalli, the author of the novel, *Before the Mayflower*, published under the name J.L. Rose. Alden Keyser moved that the Kindred members accept the slate as presented; Linda Wilman seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Executive Director Desiree Mobed described some of this year's challenges and the excitement of being together again after the separation required by the Coronavirus pandemic. The 18th Haunted House was held, Randal Charlton's programs on his book *The Wicked Pilgrim* was another success, and Jayne Talmadge's book of essays for Duxbury 2020 was the all-time bestseller in the Alden Barn shop. The Fourth of July parade, led by Alden Ringquist, took place because of the enthusiasm of Janet Ritch. Working together, Alden and Delano descendants participated, and although no prize was won, Desiree thinks our float gave out the most candy! Other notable successes were the Speak for Thyself Awards dinner held two nights ago under the leadership of Anne Cobuzzi, in the tent under torrential rain. Other highlights of the year include the homecoming of some of the chinaware used in the Log Cabin Tea Room, given by John Bradford Alden, and the publication of Stephen O'Neill's catalog of the archaeology exhibit.

Presenting Desiree with a gift for "being everywhere at once," Pauline acknowledged Desiree's strong program skills, passion for history, and for "becoming" an Alden by osmosis. Pauline also acknowledged the contributions of bookkeeper Carol Smith, other staff, Board members, and Advisory Board members.

Christopher Lee performed the roll call. The oldest attendee was Barbara Dillon, at age 93; the youngest was Ellie Harris, at age 6. The attendee from the greatest distance was Debby Warner Anderson, who came in Pilgrim dress with her dog Harley, in a camper all the way from San Diego. Most descendants attending the Annual Meeting this year (both in person and on Zoom) were from Joseph with a total of twenty-five, rather than from Elizabeth with a total of twenty-three. Ruth had twenty attendees; David, eleven; Sarah, thirteen; Rebecca, one; Jonathan, seven; and John Jr., one.

A number of authors were present in addition to Jennifer Sinsigalli. They included Sydney Blake, author of the play *Young Pilgrims;* Marian R. Carlson who wrote *Adventures of Pilgrim Plantation*; and Alden Porter III, who wrote *Unwavering Success*.

Pauline adjourned the meeting at 12:30 p.m.

FINANCIAL REPORT



Financial Statements:

This Report is to be read in conjunction with the attached Financial Statements dated 6/30/2022.

Statement of Activities:

- 1. **Revenues:** Total Revenues were \$259,750 vs. \$229,773 in the prior year. <u>Contributions and Grants</u> were up by \$8k. (Grants were up, Annual Fund ran behind last year by about \$9k.) <u>Museum and Events</u> were up \$32k. (Admissions were up \$4k, Annual Meeting up \$5k, Haunted House up \$3k, Speak up \$23k-two Speak events were held during the fiscal year)-WE GOT BACK INTO BUSINESS THIS YEAR!
- 2. **Expenses**: Operating Expenses excluding 97 Alden Expenses were up \$36K. This is also attributable to being back in business-increased use of Grant monies and increased event expenses (Speaks).
- 3. **Other:** Capital Campaign contributions were \$305k (cash and stock). Of this \$257k cash and Stocks valued at \$45k were transferred to the Endowment Account at Fidelity.

Statement of Position:

Our <u>Cash</u> position is good. <u>Investments</u> are marked up to market. The total amount shown this year is only higher than last year due to Capital Campaign contributions (see **** on the Financial Statements for breakdown). The downturn in the market impacted the endowment portion of our account. However, with the way the account is structured we fared better that the overall market.

12 months ending 06/30/2022:

S&P 500- (10.62%)

Bloomberg Aggregate Bond Market- (10.29%)

AKA Fidelity Account- (6.61%)

Just before the up-turn in interest rates, we were able to obtain additional financing from Rockland Trust to be used for badly needed roof replacements on the barn and the cottage at the rear of the property and several other projects. The amount of the loan was \$75,000 at 3.5% for a 5-year term.
